In this role, you will design and implement a comprehensive performing arts curriculum while providing direct line management, coaching, and development for sessional youth workers and volunteers. Your leadership will ensure that young people benefit from an engaging, inclusive, and high-standard programme. As the Programme Lead, you will oversee Inspire's Performing Programme, optimizing the use of our state-of-the-art performing arts studio and music room. You will also take the lead on organizing performing arts events and delivering targeted, funded projects to enhance the programme's reach and impact. This role integrates performing arts into the broader youth work framework, supporting and inspiring young people to express themselves, develop new skills, and achieve personal growth. Responsibilities include programme planning, delivery, and collaboration with the wider team to ensure success.
